
**GETTING TO PARLIAMENT HOUSE FROM AIRPORT** 

#### Car/Uber/Taxi

7.9km (approx. 10min.) From Canberra Airport Terminal Cct, Australian Capital Territory 2609

#### **Public Transport**

The best way to get from Canberra Airport (CBR) to Parliament House without a car is to line 3 bus and line 57 bus which takes 39 mins



## **AT PARLIAMENT HOUSE**

You can park in the Forecourt Basement car park most days. You can validate your parking ticket for free if you spend \$25 or more in The Parliament Shop. View parking fees

#### Accessible spaces are near the lifts.

#### Taxi or rideshare

There are separate taxi ranks and ride-share bays in the Forecourt Basement car park.

#### Bus

Bus stops are on Federation Mall, about 200 metres from our public entrance.

#### Bike

Bike racks are in the Forecourt Basement car park. Bikes cannot be brought into Parliament House.

#### **Accessibility at Parliament House**

#### Indoor surfaces

All public areas are accessible by wheelchair. Be aware, there are a variety of floor coverings including polished stone, timber, and high-pile carpets.

#### Wheelchairs

You can borrow a wheelchair for free from the Information Desk in the Marble Foyer. You will need to present a photo ID.

#### Accessible adult change facility

A toilet and change facility that caters for users with high support needs and their carers is located on Level 1, adjacent to the Post Office.

#### **Guide dogs**

Guide dogs and other assistance animals accompanied by their handler are welcome in public areas.

## ENTRY TO CONFERENCE IMPORTANT INFORMATION

#### Tickets and check-in information:

If you have received your confirmation email from AIVL, your name will be on the conference registration list (Speakers, AIVL board members and scholarship holder names are automatically added to the entry list). Once you finish the security checkpoint at the parliament house, you will be directed towards the Great hall's entrance.

At the entrance of the Great hall, you will see AIVL's registration desk where AIVL volunteers will tick your name off the list and provide you with an ID sticker to enter the conference. This will complete the check-in and registration for the conference.
