Assumptions:	The following are assumptions made upon recruitment of participants into groups sessions: All facilitators are peers with lived experience of drug use that they are willing to share. Facilitators may or may not be Indigenous. All participants are peers with some lived experience of illicit drug use and identify as Aboriginal. All participants have had some contact with BBV sector and/or AOD sector. All participants can speak English.						
Preparation:		Recruitment Method:					
Listener to orientate Support regarding facilitation style, expectations and session content. Support to brief Listener to enable respectful, supporting, and effective engagement All facilitators must be clear regarding – lived experience they are willing to share – any potentially triggering / sensitive topics.		Listener will liaise with Support in order to develop an appropriate engagement strategy. If possible a range of recruitment strategies will be used, each being evaluated to determine their relative effectiveness
