Position Description:

The Hep C Community National Campaign Coordinator will provide leadership and support to the implementation of the It's Your Right campaign. The It's Your Right campaign is a peer-led, co-designed campaign driving progress toward hepatitis C elimination in Australia by 2030. The campaign aims to increase uptake of harm reduction, hepatitis C prevention, testing, treatment, and liver health care across community and custodial settings. It's Your Right is supported by ECA and funded by the Commonwealth Department of Health, Disability and Ageing.

You will support the state-based implementation and evaluation of the campaign in partnership with our member organisations, partners and funders. This role will work alongside our Hep C Custodial National Campaign Coordinator. The position requires a contractor who is highly adaptable, collaborative, and pragmatic, and who can support the current campaign rollout and the capabilities of our peer-led network. This is a meaningful and exciting opportunity to join our impactful people who use drugs community-controlled organisation and our small and dynamic team of people with lived-living experience!

1. Understanding and demonstrated alignment with the AIVL mission and values.
2. Understanding of the lived-living experience of illicit drug use, and the ability to connect with a diversity of people who use(d) drugs illicitly.
3. Demonstrated leadership work experience in a related field.
4. High-level coordination capability and problem-solving skills.
5. Passion for evidence-based peer-led harm reduction and health promotion.
6. Great communicator with soft people skills, able to stimulate engagement.
7. Strong project management skills and relevant experience managing projects, including preparing documentation, building relationships, and following organisational processes.
8. Excellent organisation and time management skills with a demonstrated ability to plan, manage work priorities, and complete concurrent tasks to a high standard within strict deadlines.
9. Excellent facilitation and consensus-building skills with demonstrated ability to work collaboratively with a range of stakeholders from diverse backgrounds.
10. Team player with a flexible, inclusive, adaptive, and can-do attitude.
